We look forward to seeing you at the next one.

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
VALENTINES DISCO

FUNDRAISING UPDATE

OUTDOOR PLAY EQUIPMENT

We are concentrating our current fundraising efforts on outdoor play equipment for the students. With thanks to generous donations from Unite the Union, Smurfit Kappa and the The Cobtree Charity Trust, we have been able to purchase a large wooden train carriage, trikes, scooters and giant musical instruments (see below) for the hard standing playgrounds. As we are awaiting delivery on most of these, they will make welcome additions to the playgrounds from next term. This is a great start but with

the support of local businesses we are aiming to greatly add to this in the coming months.

We also have grand plans for the school field, which hopefully some of you will have seen when they were displayed at the Easter Fair this week. We have had three companies in to design and quote for what will be a very impressive grand play area for the students. We will keep you updated with the outcomes of our funding applications for this exciting project.

We were also successful in an application to Santander Community Plus for £5,000 for specially adapted trikes. This means that we have been able to order one trike for each PMLD class in the school
