NEW SOFT PLAY ROOM

We are pleased to announce that the new soft play room has now been installed. This was funded by a £9,888 grant from The Big Lottery Fund Awards 4 All and a £14,604 grant from The Baily Thomas Charitable Trust.

We are delighted with the new room which has been completely replaced with brand new flooring and wall coverings. It contains not only a new ball pool, trampoline, den, steps and slide, but also features new technology to support the learning of our students in the room. The giant floor piano will be controlled by students to make sounds and activate colours with touch, and a responsive balance beam changes the room colour and makes sounds when the students walk on it.



FUNDRAISING UPDATE

E D D Y S T O N E C H A L L E N G E

This month Michael Garcia undertook a formidable challenge at sea in order to raise money for the school.

Billed as 'a tough event' requiring 'a high level of stamina and a dogged Determination, designed for athletes at the top of their game', this was a daunting 28 mile race out in the Atlantic Ocean.



Michael managed to raise an equally impressive £792 in sponsorship for this event. Thank you so much to everyone who sponsored Michael for this, he was particularly touched by all of the parents and carers who supported him and the fact that he had received so much support really helped to motivate him on the day.





Thanks to everyone who sent in their Sainsbury's Active Kids vouchers to us this year.

We have just placed our order of a wall mounted AND1 basketball back board and hoop and an inclusive Giant Go 4 Goal and base together with basketballs.

We have also been able to order some much needed basic PE items such as mats, beanbags and sequencing spots.



VISILIFT+ SCREEN

We have just taken delivery of our new VisiLift+ screen which was purchased with a £2,500 grant from the Kent Community Fund and a £2,492 grant from the Boshier-Hinton Foundation.

This amazing piece of technology will allow our students with high levels of physical disability and complex sensory needs access to fun interactive learning technology that is currently not accessible to them.

The 42" interactive touch-sensitive plasma has an in-built PC and is height adjustable with tilt. It has two powered columns which raise and lower it and the screen can be rotated to any angle from horizontal to vertical.

The screen can be used flat like a table and height angled so that students can use it in wheelchairs or from the floor with ease to within centimetres of their bodies.

Importantly, the screen is multi-touch so, unlike an iPad or white board, students can get lots of feedback from it through using both hands. Several students are also able to use it effectively at the same time.



LLOYDS BANK COMMUNITY FUND

Friends of Five Acre Wood School applied to this fund and have been short-listed for the next stage - the public vote. Lloyd's said:

'Nearly 600 Lloyds Banking Group colleagues worked together in selection panels to review 4,500 applications and decide the final four organisations short-listed in each of the 352

communities. The standard was very high this year and it's a great achievement to have made the short-list.
