## HALL OF FAME SINGLE



How often do you get to record and release your own music single?? As you are perhaps aware, we recently have and we are hoping it now takes the world by storm!

How did it all happen? We have worked closely with our friends at DeeVu records and their amazing stable of artists over a number of years - they are incredible supporters of the School. For example, they have championed of our annual Woodstock music festivals and also staged regular concerts at the School for our pupils, to give them outstanding experiences.

With the restrictions that have been in place we have unfortunately not been able to hold any concerts recently – so together with DeeVu we came up with a different and very exciting plan! We decided to record and film our own music single, with the support of the amazing Kent based singer songwriter Jack Rose.

25 pupils had the unique experience of visiting a studio to record their vocals and over 200 pupils were involved in the filming of the video at the School. The whole project was turned around in only 4 days and it impacted on a range of learning related outcomes including communication, independence and inclusion.

Our version of 'Hall of Fame' is our 'Us' Story – it's about 'achieving new possibles', believing in yourself and following your dreams.

'World premieres' of the music video were held across our School sites on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> December. Think Digital Media Van, complete with 3 large LED screens, party cannons, red carpets and food and you'll get a sense of the outdoor showcase extravaganza that we had to celebrate the event!

The track is now available in 24 media stores and 240 countries worldwide – we need everyone to pre-order, save and share it, so that we can raise the profile of our extraordinary pupils, staff and School.

We have had lots of fun playing in the sensory garden and on trim trail, where we enjoy playing tag and hide and seek.

We've loved our cooking lessons and our art lessons as this has allowed us to get messy and creative!

Pinemarten class are all looking forward to the holiday break and we have lots of crafts to bring home to use as decorations!

### PRIMROSE CLASS

This term Primrose class have been working on some winter crafts and sensory activities, including a visit from Karen Littlewood from Pop up Literacy. Karen worked on the story 'Immi' with us, drawing some beautiful pictures whilst telling the story.

We have been working hard on our physio programmes and are all doing really well towards our personalised targets. We have really enjoyed group sessions for Attention Autism and music.

One of our favourite things we have been able to do this term is use the swing in the sensory garden.

For the rest of the term, we are really looking forward to exploring Christmas themed activities and sensory stories.

#### SQUIRREL CLASS

Squirrel Class have been exploring and developing our understanding of the different seasons. Our favourite has been our Seasons Tuff Tray activity.

We have also been developing our independence skills through practicing self-care routines and cooking a variety of things. Recently, we had Crumble the elf delivered from Father Christmas and we are looking forward to seeing what mischievous things he gets up to.





#### CATERPILLAR CLASS

The Caterpillars have been very busy exploring In October we explored pumpkins in various ways as well as make our own potions using caldrons and creepy crawlies with various different textures. We all enjoyed playing with the ghost train it was really spooky.

In November we explored fireworks in Attention Autism. We enjoyed the party cannons going off. Every Caterpillar was full of excitement and anticipation. It made so much mess but we loved throwing the confetti over ourselves and were asking for more.

In December we explored a winter sensory tray with rice, sliver beads, snow flake cutters, twinkle lights and tinsel. We have been reading the 'Gruffalo's Child' as our story of the week. We have been learning to transition to different parts of the school, visiting the farm and the sensory garden.

Pupils and staff in class have been getting very excited for Christmas. We have been busy decorating Christmas trees and wrapping presents in Santa's workshop. We have made lots of lovely things to take home.



Wren class have been practising their life skills. We have been following instructions and have made a range of items such as toast, milkshake, hot chocolate and biscuits.

We have also practised our personal hygiene and have followed instructions to wash our hands, face and brush hair.

#### TURTLE CLASS






In cooking, Turtle class have enjoyed making Christmas trees out of cucumber with a carrot for the star. They also made banana snow people.

## **NOTE TO PARENTS/CARERS REGARDING MEDICATION**

To ensure that your child is given the most current prescribed medication of the correct dose and at the right time, please read these guidelines:

- 1. Please ensure that all medicines sent into school are in the ORIGINAL pharmacy containers/packaging clearly labelled with:
- Your child's name
- Name of prescribed medication
- The dosage and frequency of administration
- How medicine should be given, e.g. by mouth, via feeding tube
- Date medicine was dispensed
- Expiry Date

Any nurse will have the right to refuse the administration of medication to your child if this information is not clearly shown on the label.

- 2. Please inform the school nurse of any change to your child's regular medication, including alterations to dose, frequency or medication being stopped as advised by a doctor. These alterations need to be confirmed in writing by the prescriber. We cannot accept verbal alterations and will be unable to give an amended dose unless we have the medication in its original contained with the correct information printed on the label or receive the changes in writing from the prescriber.
- 3. If your child is prescribed emergency medication (Diazepam/Midazolam for epilepsy or Anapen/Epipen for allergy) please inform the school nurse immediately. Further information from your child's doctor will be needed regarding when the emergency medication should be given and this will be kept in school so all staff are aware of what care your child needs in an emergency.
- 4. Please ensure there is a sufficient supply of all the medicines your child needs whilst in school. We will contact you to advise when we are running low.
- 5. When sending in medication, it must <u>not</u> be put in your child's bag. Instead, it should be handed directly to a member of the class staff. If your child comes into school by taxi, the medication should be given to the escort who will then hand it to a member of the class staff when they arrive at school.
