Sensory Garden

A message from Alex, our fundraiser:

'We are all about "teamwork" and one of the projects we are currently working on demonstrates the absolute best spirit of that. Our sensory garden that has been in the planning for a while now is steadily becoming a reality. Led and driven by Paul, our fabulous horticulturalist, the garden is like a huge dozing animal that is now slowly waking up. The wooden gazebo, started so brilliantly and enthusiastically by volunteers from Santander and now completed by the family of one of our staff members forms the hub of the beast – the beating heart from where all the paths will lead out. One leading down a winding path to a sensory sandpit, the path being constructed by a team of volunteers from Greggs, the sandpit dug out by a team of volunteers from Network Rail. Old tyres surround the sandpit, donated by local company AN Tyres – soon to be filled with top soil and planted up with the sea of plants donated by our friends at B&Q Maidstone. Another path will lead to an upright mirrored sensory maze - reflections from the trees and our pupils happy faces will be a treat to enjoy. A further path will lead to a log flume style water feature, making use of the natural drop of the garden. The water will flow along, sparkling in the sunshine and tinkling like little bells to a bed, where it will be captured and then re-used. Wind chimes and ribbons will dangle from the trees creating magical sounds and feelings as the breeze gently moves them. The generosity of the time given by the volunteers, along with the funding and supplies given by Greggs, Tescos, Groundwork, Gallaghers and the kindest anonymous donor have ensured this sensory garden is a truly organic and enriching experience for every single one of our students. NOTE TO PARENTS/CARERS REGARDING MEDICATION

To ensure that your child is given the most current prescribed medication of the correct dose and at the right time, please read these guidelines:

1. Please ensure that all medicines sent into school are in the ORIGINAL pharmacy containers/packaging clearly labelled with:

- Your child's name
- Name of prescribed medication
- The dosage and frequency of administration
- How medicine should be given, e.g. by mouth, via feeding tube
- Date medicine was dispensed
- Expiry Date

Any nurse will have the right to refuse the administration of medication to your child if this information is not clearly shown on the label.

2. Please inform the school nurse of any change to your child's regular medication, including alterations to dose, frequency or medication being stopped as advised by a doctor. These alterations need to be confirmed in writing by the prescriber. <u>We cannot accept verbal alterations and will be unable to give an amended dose unless we have the medication in its original contained with the correct information printed on the label or receive the changes in writing from the prescriber.</u>

3. If your child is prescribed emergency medication (Diazepam/Midazolam for epilepsy or Anapen/Epipen for allergy) please inform the school nurse immediately. Further information from your child's doctor will be needed regarding when the emergency medication should be given and this will be kept in school so all staff are aware of what care your child needs in an emergency.

4. Please ensure there is a sufficient supply of all the medicines your child needs whilst in school. We will contact you to advise when we are running low.

5. When sending in medication, it must <u>not</u> be put in your child's bag. Instead, it should be handed directly to a member of the class staff. If your child comes into school by taxi, the medication should be given to the escort who will then hand it to a member of the class staff when they arrive at school.
