In case you missed it

This week we have put in a funding application and have had to talk about our pupil's ages. This is what we found out:

- Since lockdown started, 84 of our pupils have had a birthday
- September has the highest number of birthdays 57 compared with November being the lowest at 36
- There are 87 dates in the year when no pupil has a birthday
- The 12th and 19th of the month are the most popular birth dates- with 27 pupils being born on each date
- The 30th is the least popular birth date- with only 8 pupils born on the 30th of the month
- We have 2 Christmas "babies"
- The most popular day to be born is New Year's Day 6 pupils were born on this day!
