It can be adapted to meet the demands of different social settings for youngsters, including home and school.

Emily will also be holding a Parent/Carer session on Tuesday 14th March 2023 in the school hall from 6pm-8pm. There will be an opportunity to ask questions. The session is open to Parents/Carers from other schools, at a cost of £20 per person but will be FREE to FIVE ACRE WOOD PARENTS/CARERS! This is a great opportunity and we hope to see you there. We wanted to share how volunteering at FAW came about...

Regular volunteers who work with us one day a week during term time are known as 'Growing Times'. Chris and John are our two regular volunteers, but 'Growing Times' has several other volunteers who drop in now and again to help. One of them went on to join our own site team.



'Growing Times' was started in 2019 by Paul, the OLE lead. It was created to give the volunteers a sense of belonging, as the work they do is so valuable to us. They give so much in time, skills sets, passion and enthusiasm and we wanted to recognise this.

'Growing Times' have been instrumental in helping to build our sensory garden, hop pole, chicken enclosure and cuddle corner in Apple Tree Yard as well as fencing and roofing of enclosures within

the yard. In fact, Apple Tree Yard would not look as amazing as it does now without their valuable contributions. Chris was part of the team from Lloyds Bank who helped to build the yard in 2019. We had over 100 volunteers from Lloyds Bank spread over a two-week window to build the yard from scratch. This is one of our proudest achievements.

What it means to Chris to be a volunteer at Five Acre Wood School:

"I can honestly say that I get so much out of volunteering at Five Acre Wood School and for being part of the development of 'Apple Tree Yard' from when it was just a rough piece of ground to now, a functioning outdoor learning environment.

By volunteering at the school over the years, I have seen a tangible effect this outdoor learning has had on of the lives of the children from the school. This I can see makes a lasting change and for me is very rewarding. It is very satisfying to know that you are making a difference and helping children with special needs to make their lives better. I have also made some very good friends and I am not just sat at home!"

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NOTE TO PARENTS/CARERS REGARDING MEDICATION

To ensure that your child is given the most current prescribed medication of the correct dose and at the right time, please read these guidelines:

1. Please ensure that all medicines sent into school are in the ORIGINAL pharmacy containers/packaging clearly labelled with:

- Your child's name
- Name of prescribed medication
- The dosage and frequency of administration
- How medicine should be given, e.g. by mouth, via feeding tube
- Date medicine was dispensed
- Expiry Date

Any nurse will have the right to refuse the administration of medication to your child if this information is not clearly shown on the label.

2. Please inform the school nurse of any change to your child's regular medication, including alterations to dose, frequency or medication being stopped as advised by a doctor. These alterations need to be confirmed in writing by the prescriber. <u>We cannot accept verbal alterations and will be unable to give an amended dose unless we have the medication in its original contained with the correct information printed on the label or receive the changes in writing from the prescriber.</u>

3. If your child is prescribed emergency medication (Diazepam/Midazolam for epilepsy or Anapen/Epipen for allergy) please inform the school nurse immediately. Further information from your child's doctor will be needed regarding when the emergency medication should be given and this will be kept in school so all staff are aware of what care your child needs in an emergency.

4. Please ensure there is a sufficient supply of all the medicines your child needs whilst in school. We will contact you to advise when we are running low.

5. When sending in medication, it must <u>not</u> be put in your child's bag. Instead, it should be handed directly to a member of the class staff. If your child comes into school by taxi, the medication should be given to the escort who will then hand it to a member of the class staff when they arrive at school.
