

SPARROW CLASS

This term, Sparrow class have enjoyed cooking and identifying the ingredients in recipes and this is a skill that we have been focussing on. Pupils within Sparrow are able to understand what ingredients they will be using for cooking and then recognising if we need to buy them on our weekly shopping trips.

We have been able to successfully cook cheesy garlic bread, vegetable pasta bake and rocky road (which the children loved!)

Furthermore, Sparrow have thoroughly enjoyed weekly trips to Grow 19 where we are able to practice using money in a practical situation, communicating with unfamiliar people and begin to understand denominations of change.













VOLE CLASS

Vole class have had a great term. Our topic this term has been 'Health is Wealth'; we have been focussing on healthy eating, exercise and a good sleep routine. The pupils have really enjoyed learning about this topic and have been working hard making extra tasty smoothies. We even had the parents visit to taste the smoothies. The class has been taking part in exercise sessions including dance, football and circuits whilst also creating their own exercise regime.

On a Monday, Vole class have been going to Morrison's café and pupils have been choosing a snack of their choice and waiting patiently for their food. The pupils in Vole class have behaved impeccably whilst visiting the café and we are very proud of them all for how they have behaved whilst out in the community.

The pupils have also thoroughly enjoyed attending Young Farmers this term where they have been learning how to care for the animals and understand their needs.











HONEYSUCKLE CLASS



Honeysuckle class enjoyed World Book Day, especially all the activities related to *Mr Wolf's Pancakes* and *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. We have also completed lots of activities related to numbers such as mark making, sorting, recognising and matching.





SNAIL CLASS

Snail class team have had a little redesign in our outside area allowing for more exploration on mud and sand tyres, and a small curiosity platform for us to create picnics and extend our play opportunities.

We had a fun science week where we explored different frozen materials and we also did a few experiments such as magic milk rainbows and vinegar and soda mixing. Our favourite was the Cola and Mentos mint explosive fountain.



In our Saplings sessions we have been using tools to dig and mix



mud. We have loved the new mud kitchen and looking for the signs of spring.











SNOWDROP CLASS

We have been lucky enough to have the lovely ladies from Moonbeam Theatre visit us and help us to explore different textures, scents, and stimuli related to our environments and gardens. We have listened to some amazing songs (with signs), explored soil, leaves and planted our very own seeds!

We have been working hard on our physio targets which has included accessing therapies such as Hydrotherapy, Rebound and MOVE. We have also loved accessing Sensory Circuits to improve our readiness for learning.

















The pupils love to bake and we have been doing lots of it this term. We use our switches to activate the whisk and love getting messy decorating our cakes and cookies!





MAPLE CLASS

In Maple class this term we have been learning about rivers, getting better at working as a team and enjoying lots of cooking. We have learned how to make pancakes, toasted sandwiches and pizza. We enjoyed tasting Chinese noodles and sauces. We have learned how to plan ingredients for our sandwiches and the toppings for pizza and even got involved in buying them.

In our IT lessons we have started to use the laptops and also been able to use them in our other learning. We love playing maths and phonics games.

In our daily story time, this year our book has been Gangsta Granny, by David Walliams. Our story times are also being child led and we are



getting very good at listening to our friends and asking them comprehension questions about what they have heard in the story.

The year 5's have enjoyed a Task Master project run by the Law University of Warwick and they were amazing at suggesting ideas and working together.

SWALLOW CLASS







Swallow class have been learning about heroes and people that

help us this term. We were really lucky to meet a paramedic and got to go on an ambulance. We got to ask lots of questions and to try on the uniform. Joshua and Lakishia loved wearing the uniform. Pupils also got to meet a policeman and take it in turns to sit in the police car.



FOX CLASS





This term Fox class have been learning about different animals. We explored these topics through sensory play and used our favourite methods of learning to develop our skills further. Fox class also enjoyed using safety knives to prepare some food that our pets might enjoy. We were also lucky enough to have a meet and greet session with the yard guinea pigs!













CEDARWOOD CLASS









Some Cedarwood pupils performed a dance at the Stag Theatre in Sevenoaks at the Love 2 Dance show alongside pupils from Oxford Road in Beechwood and Oakwood classes. They practiced their routine during their weekly dance club on Fridays with one of the teachers from EDC, a local dance school. Our pupils did their personal best to memorise their dance routine and perform it twice in front of a big audience.

The Bikeability team came to school and pupils participating felt proud of their progress and skills in cycling independently and feeling more confident on their bikes.



Pupils have continued to access the local community, to do travel training to town and to

use services and practice their communication skills with unfamiliar adults. Every week they visit Shepway library to choose and to help each other get new books and to ask for help. Pupils go shopping to buy their snacks and the ingredients needed for cooking their lunch on Thursdays. They also visited Maidstone market to talk to the stall



holders and to find out more about skills needed in their workplace and to reflect if they personally had such skills or qualities. Every Thursday, pupils have continued to develop their home cooking skills and to be the best they can be to serve a delicious meal and a pudding every week.





We celebrated Rohan's achievements in receiving his certificate for his ASDAN Life Skills Challenge

which he completed last academic year: a big "WELL DONE" to Rohan!!!

We wish our pupils and their families a very pleasant break and we look forward to seeing everyone in Term 5!!!




RED DEER CLASS





Red Deer pupils have had a great Term 4. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about different animals and have explored this topic through a variety of activities including small world play, sensory exploration, art and reading stories. In addition, we created and wrote colour coded sentences. Red Deer class particularly love cooking! We made delicious cupcakes, monkey toast and fairy bread (an Australian snack)!

TURTLE CLASS

This term in Turtle class, we have enjoyed some football sessions with the coaches from The Stones Community Trust. Pupils worked hard to develop their footballing skills through drills and games. They used team work and communication skills to work well together.

Pupils also took part in a park reward trip. We began the term by learning all about road safety. We learnt about road signs and how to cross the road safely and recreated roads on the playground and role played being safe. To practice our safety skills, we walked to the local park where we all had a wonderful time playing with our friends and demonstrated staying safe in the community.

HEDGEHOG CLASS









This term in Hedgehog class our topic has been 'Health is Wealth'. We have been very busy making smoothies, exploring different types of fruit and vegetables and enjoyed activities linked to the story *Supertato*. We have also been enjoying our inclusive dance sessions.







ROE DEER CLASS

Roe Deer class have been exploring this term's theme of 'Animal Magic'. We have been looking at fictional stories and non-fiction texts in literacy all about animals and their environments; we have worked collaboratively to make fact files and posters about our topic as well as working on descriptive writing skills. We are very independent when following cooking instructions and have made some yummy dishes; the sweet ones are our favourites! During leisure we have been using IT devices such as coloured keyboards to help with typing skills and interactive games to work on our teamwork and sharing skills. This term we have also had assemblies with Hedgehog class and we have learnt about sharing our space with others and celebrating others achievements, as well as enjoying sensory exploration as a group.

PRIMROSE CLASS





Primrose pupils have made chocolate nest eggs which they ate during break time. They learnt to follow simple instructions, wait their turn and share their learning space.



Weekly, pupils have been taking part in sensory circuit activities sometimes in the outside learning area and in the hall.





Pupils have been using a communication board to tell adults which colour paints they want to use. During a clever finger activity, they independently peeled a banana and used fine motor skills to cut it into small pieces and eat it for snack.



Pupils have worked hard in numeracy, identifying big and small objects and also 2D shapes.






During free play, some pupils investigated how a battery drill worked and, with peers, placed shapes on the board and put small screws into the hole. Together, they used a screwdriver to tighten the screws.

In addition, pupils have learned about healthy eating and the importance of sleep and exercise for health. They really enjoyed comparing exercise videos and even making their own for their friends to try.






BUMBLEBEE CLASS

WREN CLASS



Wren class had the amazing opportunity to engage with a paramedic and police officer who came into school in week 4. We focused on learning about how these people help us and we came out of our day with so much knowledge about how we can help each other and ask for help from people who help us in our community.











Dormouse Class thoroughly enjoyed our learning topic 'Animal Magic' during Term 4. We explored various types of animals such as mammals, farm animals, woodland creatures, and zoo animals. As part of our learning experience, we were fortunate enough to have a tortoise spend a day with us in class. The pupils learned how to properly care for the tortoise by feeding, bathing and providing him with the necessary space and time for exercise.













WHALE CLASS

This term we have been learning all about rivers. We have found out about animals that live in our rivers, researched about the rivers Medway, Thames and Severn and created river paintings.

In Forest School we have been exploring the Forest School area at Palace Wood. Some of Whales have been spending time at The Yard, helping to care for the animals.







Some of our pupils have taken part in cricket and a girls' football events. They enjoyed learning new skills, playing together as a team and meeting children from other schools.





Whale class enjoyed their visit to Aunt Sally's Kitchen in Allington. We ordered and paid for our food independently. Back at school we used our café visit to develop our letter writing and maths skills.















LADYBIRD CLASS

Ladybird class have had a jam-packed term; we all had a fantastic Book Week looking at different stories, including some sensory stories where we could touch, smell and move within the story. We enjoyed the story of the Gruffalo and explored making Gruffalo crumble and decorating a Gruffalo with loose parts activities; everyone dressed up in fantastic costumes, and all had fun.



















OTTER CLASS

Otter class have enjoyed their project of Health is Wealth. We have been making smoothies which pupils thoroughly enjoyed. Each pupil created their own recipe with step-by-step instructions, they chose the fruit they were going to use and were able to use both of these pieces of work to help them create their smoothie. Parents were invited in



to re-create the activity and pupils enjoyed showing their parents what they have been learning and were able to independently create a smoothie.



We held a non-uniform day in order to donate long-life food to foodbanks, which again linked in with our termly project. Pupils were able to help sort the food items and pack them into boxes before working with another class to deliver the food. We have also been continuing to engage with shopping trips off-site.
