
The sun was shining as pupils, staff, and families




themed sensory trays that offered hands-on fun and exploration. From squishy textures to colourful surprises, the trays were a big success and added an extra festive touch to the afternoon.







NEW SINGLE RELEASE


Lots of excellent opportunities in PE for pupils so far this term and many more to come for next term!

chat with The Rev'd Canon Sue Brewer, who spoke to the pupils about her job in the church.




TOLKIEN CLASS

FAWBULOUS BUS


Our double-decker bus will be making its grand return this Easter half term—fully converted and more exciting than ever!



LISZT CLASS










We had a fantastic time celebrating World Book Day with *Tabby McTat* as our chosen book. We even decorated our classroom door using our feet to paint!
