



Ennis-Hill is a secondary class within the Practical learning approach, catering to key stage 4 pupils. The class has 13 pupils, aged 14–15 years and are supported by a Class Teacher and 3 Teaching Assistants.

This year, our curriculum will explore a broad range of engaging topics including; “Me and My Future”, “My Global Family”, “Being Active”, “Old Times and New Times”, “Let’s Get to Work” and “Let’s Go Travelling”. Through these topics, pupils will develop essential self-help, independence and life skills, while working towards their individual EHCP outcomes.

All pupils in Ennis-Hill Class are working towards ASDAN Lifeskills Challenge Awards, which focus on building practical skills for independence and provide opportunities to achieve recognised qualifications.

Practical learning is central to our approach. Every week, pupils plan, prepare and cook meals, including a main course, starter or side dish and dessert. Pupils participate in regular visits to cafes and shops, gaining valuable real-world experience and learning essential skills for life in the community.
