

Wright class is within the Functional learning approach. In class, there are 14 students, a Class Teacher, a Senior Teaching Assistant, 2 Teaching Assistants and a Healthcare Assistant. The class is based at the sixth form satellite site at Oxford Road.

Students are adapting to their curriculum, their new learning environment and routines at Oxford Road. They are working towards completing new accreditations linked to their functional pathway. They transition to a variety of learning areas within the school and the local community and access a personalised curriculum within their learning pathway.

Students enjoy learning and taking part in problems solving activities and discussions, where they share their ideas and viewpoints and support each other. They enjoy celebrating each other's achievements and display a positive attitude by following our school's values.

Students are encouraged to continue to develop their sense of responsibility, life skills, communication skills and their growth mindset to help develop independence and confidence in taking on an active role in their immediate community and wider communities and to secure ways that will help them to manage future challenges with greater confidence and self-efficacy.

Students work towards being part of the world outside of school, learning about workplace expectations, future independent or assisted home life setting. Standards are set in school during practical work, work experience and functional learning in class. They choose their vocational activities and engage in enrichment activities to support them to develop their personal targets and soft skills to help prepare for when they transition to the post-19 provision of their choice. Students are looking forward to embracing new learning experiences offered in the sixth form functional pathway, and continuing to develop the skills they need for the future.
