



Elgar class are a key stage 2 class within the Structured learning approach and consists of 10 pupils and 3 members of staff.

The curriculum is tailored to the individual needs of each pupil and is delivered through a TEACCH approach. This involves pupils being taught in small groups, sharing games and resources with adult support, whilst learning skills, knowledge and understanding within activities that provide an opportunity to develop curiosity, engagement and language/communication skills. Pupils also work at a 1:1 area with an adult and are taught new skills at the individual level of each pupil, focusing on maths, literacy and key skills. Pupils also work at independent workstations; These are filled with individualised motivating and interesting tasks and resources for them to complete independently.

This year, pupils will be learning about a wide variety of topics including; our senses, body parts, money and time. In addition to topic lessons, numeracy and literacy are designed to help build key life skills and support independence.

Pupils will engage in sensory exploration and will be making trips to access the community. This will include places to enhance topic learning, as well as regular local trips to shops to build independence skills when accessing public places and how to use money correctly.

Pupils will be working on a variety of exciting and useful life skills this year and are very excited to share this knowledge throughout the year.
