



Handel class is within the Structured learning approach. The curriculum is tailored to meet the pupils' individual needs. We use the TEACCH approach, which is especially effective for pupils with unique learning styles. Clear visuals and structure help to enable pupils to feel calm, confident and independent in their learning.

Pupils learn through:

- Small group learning: With the support of adults, pupils enjoy shared games and resources, developing their curiosity, communication and engagement skills.
- One-on-one sessions: We provide dedicated time for each pupil to work individually with an adult on new skills in literacy, maths and other key areas.
- Independent workstations: These areas are filled with motivating and interesting tasks, allowing pupils to build their confidence and focus by completing assignments independently.

Our leisure area features a swing chair, soft bean bags and cushions, providing a "home from home" environment where pupils can relax and self-regulate. We have games, books and toys to encourage shared and cooperative play, helping to build social skills.

Learning in class extends beyond maths and literacy. Pupils enjoy a variety of engaging enrichment activities, including art, cooking and book sharing. We love to learn about the changing seasons and celebrate them as a class. We look forward to a year of discovery, growth and fun.
