Finally, thank you all for your continued support and here's to a fantastic year ahead at Five Acre Wood School!


Creativity in the Community

FAW Artwork Brings Colour to Shepway

Five Acre Wood School was recently invited by local housing provider Golding Homes to create artwork for the hoarding surrounding their new development in the Cambridge Crescent area of Shepway, where 236 new high-quality, affordable, and energy-efficient homes are being built. Golding Homes, and project partner Skillcrown, wanted to involve the local community in the transformation of their area so they reached out to us to help add colour and vibrancy to the hoardings.



After pupils from Snodland had the opportunity to look around the Oxford Road site, pupils from both sites visited the Shepway hub on Northumberland Road to see their vibrant creations proudly displayed both inside and



taking a short walk to see their work officially unveiled — enlarged and displayed for all to enjoy on the hoarding boards surrounding the building site.

The colourful pieces, inspired by Romero Britto and Friedensreich Hundertwasser, centre around the themes of community, animals, love and sustainability.

Each design radiates positivity and creativity, transforming the



once plain hoarding boards into a joyful celebration of art and local spirit. Teacher Karine said: "Our students fully embraced the opportunity to take part in the art project to celebrate in bold colours and patterns the building of the new and exciting

housing development in our local community. The display looks absolutely amazing." Matt Arnold, Land and Development Director, Skillcrown added: "It's fantastic to see the students' creativity making such a positive impact in the

heart of the Shepway community."

You can see this fantastic addition on Cambridge Crescent, just a stone's throw away from our Oxford Road site — a true testament to the talent of our students!









Transforming Spaces, Inspiring Futures

On 25th September, invited guests joined us to celebrate the launch of several pioneering projects at Five Acre Wood. The event began with inspiring speeches from staff, supporters, and pupils, followed by wonderful entertainment from our signing choir and Ellen Blane. Guests then enjoyed delicious catering from Grow 19 before touring the school to see the newly completed ventures in action.

Our new additions include:

The FAWbulous Bus – a double-decker soft play bus generously donated by Norman and the team at *Nu*-*Venture*, and brought to life through the support of trustees, fundraisers, and many others.

The 7FAW7 – a former Airbus A319 transformed into a fully accessible library, inspiring a love of reading. This visionary project, repurposing a fuselage to overcome spatial constraints, has created a cost-effective and imaginative space that enriches our school environment. Just as the aircraft once took people on journeys across Europe, it now takes our pupils on journeys of discovery.

The FAWtilus – once a freefall lifeboat, now a distinctive counselling space supporting mental health and wellbeing. Its playful, imaginative design makes counselling feel welcoming rather than intimidating, helping to break down barriers around seeking support.

Platform FAW – a hands-on learning space where pupils can master real-world production skills in coffee roasting. With guidance from Esther Hope-Gibbs of Hope Espresso, this inspiring enterprise has firmly established us as one of only two schools in Europe with a roastery.

The FAWtique – our luxury farm and school shop, offering a unique space for pupils to gain invaluable retail and customer service experience.

These projects have only been made possible through the generosity, creativity, and commitment of our entire community. Together, they are not just unique learning spaces but life-changing opportunities — ensuring our pupils develop the skills, confidence, and joy they deserve.

Celebrating Successes

At the beginning of October, we proudly hosted a wonderful evening celebrating the incredible achievements of our students from both our Snodland and Oxford Road sites. It was a lovely opportunity to recognise the hard work, perseverance, and progress of our students as they received certificates for the qualifications they achieved during the 2024–25 academic

year.



This year, 107 students across the school undertook qualifications

collectively achieving an

outstanding 323 individual awards! These qualifications, varying from ASDAN awards, BTECs, and Functional Skills, reflect the diverse learning pathways we offer, designed to celebrate every individual's strengths,

interests, and talents.

Our KS4 students achieved fantastic results through both the Formal Learning



Approach and the Practical Learning Approach. Our Post-16 learners also shone brightly, achieving success through the Functional Learning Approach and the Sensory Learning Approach.

We could not be prouder of every student for their hard work and resilience — and of the incredible progress made by all.

Congratulations to every one of our certificate recipients for their achievements and continued commitment to learning. We look forward to seeing what they accomplish next!

Class Open Days

This term, our Loose site welcomed families into school for our Coffee Mornings and Stay and Play sessions. It was wonderful to see so many friendly faces filling the classrooms and corridors, with children proudly sharing their daily learning environment with their grown-ups. Families had the chance to join in with a variety of activities, play alongside

their children, and spend time talking with staff. The sessions were filled with fun, laughter, and plenty of memorable moments—we hope everyone



who joined us enjoyed the experience as much as we did!

Structured Art Gallery

Secondary Structured hosted their annual Art Gallery event, transforming a marquee into a vibrant exhibition space that perfectly captured the feel of a professional gallery.

Outdoor Learning Environment

Our Outdoor Learning Environment (OLE) at our Loose site is a vibrant space where pupils learn, explore, and thrive. The OLE brings together all aspects of outdoor learning and vocational skills, offering a wealth of opportunities for pupils to grow, connect with nature, and develop independence.

At its heart lies a thriving vegetable and fruit garden, surrounded by paths leading to different learning zones. Pupils plant, nurture, and harvest produce used in cooking lessons or sold through mini-enterprise projects. They can also pick apples and crush them in our apple press to make apple juice right under the very tree they picked the apples from. A nearby polytunnel allows horticulture sessions to continue whatever the weather, while our picket fenced herb and fruit garden is alive with colours, scents, and textures. The OLE is also home to rich wildlife areas, including a frog pond, bird hide and feeding station, and log piles for insects.

Recently, we have installed a willow dome which we hope to turn into a storytelling area, a hop pole, which we plan to grow Kent hops up, and our forest school area beneath our magnificent 150-year-old oak trees, where our local community of grey squirrels benefit from the acorns. Pupils have been busy planting native trees and hedging plants to create wildlife corridors and we already have a den of foxes with a mother and three cubs. These spaces encourage exploration, creativity, and calm — helping pupils manage anxiety and discover joy in learning outdoors.

The OLE is cared for by our dedicated staff, pupils, and a small team of volunteers who give their time each week to help build and maintain this special space. Together, they create lasting memories and a truly transformative environment that nurtures confidence, wellbeing, and a lifelong love of nature.

FAWrest School

We have been very busy down in FAWrest school this term, enjoying seeing a multitude of classes exploring nature and learning through play, expressing our ethos of Freedom, Adventure and Wonder.





This term has also seen the completion of two brand new exciting areas, one being the mud kitchen and the second being a music zone. Our new mud kitchen was built by South East Water volunteers and is being thoroughly enjoyed by the pupils, enabling them to explore a variety of sensory mediums through messy play.



Our new music zone has



been created by OLE staff, using all repurposed and recycled materials that were destined for the skip or landfill, creating a space which can be enjoyed by the pupils whilst also being able to discuss the importance of sustainability and reducing waste.

EYFS Learning Approach

We are delighted to welcome you to another exciting year in EYFS! It promises to be full of wonder, discovery, and adventure, as the children dive into a wide range of themes and topics designed to inspire their natural curiosity, spark their imagination, and nurture a lifelong love of learning. Each term has been planned to create learning opportunities that encourage children to explore, experiment, and connect with the world around them.

Term 1 – Getting to Know You

This term, we have focused on building strong relationships and celebrating what makes each of us special. The children have been exploring their likes and motivators, expressing themselves through animation activities, and embracing the magic of autumn.

We have been jumping in crunchy leaves, feeling different textures, and discovering the season's colours and sounds. Through sensory play and outdoor learning, children have been encouraged to ask questions, explore freely, and develop their confidence in new spaces.

Term 3 - Understanding Our World

We will travel back in time to uncover the secrets of dinosaurs and fossils, digging, investigating, and making exciting discoveries. We will then leap into the present and future with robots and machines, encouraging children to tinker, build, and problem-solve. This topic is designed to ignite curiosity.

Term 5 – Animal Magic

This term will be packed with curious creatures and exciting habitats as we discover woodland and safari animals. Through storytelling, sensory exploration, and imaginative play, children will deepen their understanding of animals and their environments. This theme encourages children to ask questions and express themselves creatively.

Term 2 – Seasonal Sparks

Next term's theme, Seasonal Sparks, will light up our learning with celebrations of Spooksville, Diwali, and, of course, the Christmas festivities. We will be exploring light and dark, sounds and celebrations, and seasonal changes through creative, multisensory activities.

We will be hosting our EYFS Christmas Stay and Play with the OLE — a magical opportunity for children and families to explore together. Keep an eye out for more details!

Term 4 – The Great Outdoors

With spring on the way, we will explore life on the farm, learn about animal life cycles, and experience the rhythms of the changing seasons. The children will engage in handson, exploratory play, supporting their understanding of the world and living things.

Term 6 - Travel

We will round off the year with a truly exciting Travel topic. The children will be exploring different ways to travel through projects around trains, planes, and construction. This theme will be filled with role play, problemsolving, and imaginative journeys, helping children build their communication, collaboration, and independence skills.

We will continue to learn through hands-on experiences that encourage exploration with our senses, spending time in our outdoor environments, noticing seasonal changes, engaging in themed activities, and enjoying favourite books.

This term, we have been busy exploring our new classroom and getting to know each other. There are so many fabulous things to play with, both inside and in our outdoor area! We have been getting used to our daily routines, learning to use our schedules, and enjoying

Flipper Class have enjoyed discovering different areas of the school including, the big playground, the MUGA, the Sensory Garden and especially big soft play!







Hedwig Class

Hedwig Class have had an exciting and enriching term, filled with hands on learning and engaging experiences. Our topics this term have included animation, fall, and Halloween, which have sparked curiosity and creativity among the children. The class has settled in beautifully, with strong friendships blossoming and impressive cooperation developing during group activities and free play.











A highlight of the term has been our Forest School sessions, where pupils have explored the outdoors through sensory play and storytelling, particularly enjoying activities inspired by *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. These sessions have encouraged teamwork, communication, and a love for nature.

In the classroom, the children have been

progressing well with their TEACCH rotations, making great use of visual aids to support their independence and understanding. It has been a joyful and productive term full of growth and discovery.










Marley Class
